Group Seminars were held over a two day period focusing on the role and future of CIBPA in Canada.

Overall, the Convention was a great success and all delegates went home with new ideas and objectives to strengthen both the local chapters and the National Federation of CIBPA. The weekend was capped off by a Grand Gala held at the Cabot Club in Windsor, with over 500 guests attending.


The Federation serves as a business and professional networking vehicle for its constituent members, as well as a voice for the Italian Canadian business and professional community across Canada. Areas of interest to the Federation span business, professional, civic and cultural issues of common concern to all members. This interest is expressed through published position papers prepared through member surveys and workshops. Three of its more high profile papers focused on providing solution to Canadian the National Unity challenge. recommendations on how to improve Canada's national economy; and problems and solutions for improving Ontario's Education System.

Board member Rose Bava represented the membership in a Cross Canada CIBPA meeting chaired by the National Federation on February 10th, 1996.

The meeting, chaired in Ottawa, was the first teleconferenced meeting ever held by the National Federation. This new, less expensive, medium was chosen to assist local CIBPA clubs across Canada to find more efficient and effective means of gaining representation.

Many important issues were discussed at the meeting including CIBPA access and representation on the Internet, settlement of the internment issues during World War II, and the role of the National Federation.

We anxiously await resolution of these and other pressing issues of concern to all CIBPA members in the near future.



The Joy of Growing Up Italian

(Continued from Fall 1995 Newsletter)...There was another difference between US and THEM. We had gardens, not just flower gardens, but huge gardens where we grew tomatoes, tomatoes, and more tomatoes. We ate them, cooked them, jarred them. Of course, we also grew peppers, basil, lettuce and squash. Everybody had a grapevine and a fig tree and in the fall everybody made homemade wine, lots of it!

Of course, those gardens thrived because we also had something else it seemed our Canadian friends didn't have. We had a It's not that they didn't have Grandfather! grandfathers, it's just that they didn't live in the same house, or on the same block. They visited their grandfathers. We ate with ours and God forbid we didn't see him at least once a day. I can still remember my grandfather telling me about how he came to Canada as a young man, "on the boat". How the family lived in a "rented tenement" and took in borders in order to help make ends meet, how he decided he didn't want his children (five sons and two daughters) to grow up in that environment. All of this, of course, in his own version of Italian/English, which I soon learned to understand quite well.

So when he saved enough, and I could never figure out how, he bought a house. That house served as the family headquarters for the next 40 years. I remember how he hated to leave, would rather sit on the back porch and watch his garden grow and, when he did leave for some special occasion, had to return as quickly as possible. After all, "nobody's watching the house". I also remember the holidays when all the relatives would gather at my grandfather's house and there'd be tables full of food and homemade wine and music. Women in the kitchen, men in the living room and kids, kids everywhere. I must have a half million


cousins, first and second, and some who aren't even related but, what did it matter. And my grandfather, his pipe in his mouth, his fine moustache trimmed, would sit in the middle of it all grinning his mischievous smile, his dark eyes twinkling, surveying his domain, proud of his family and how well his children had done. One was a cop, one a fireman, one had his trade, and of course there was always the rogue. And the girls, they had all married well and had fine husbands and healthy children and everyone knew respect.


FALL 1995 DINNER


CIBPA/LUISA BOCCE TOURNAMENT '95
